The future

Just a note that the RVE PAC is acting to support the upcoming MJE PAC with 'starter funds'. I'll let our chair address that with you.

Please note the upcoming dates of November 20 when the District Staff will present their proposal for Westside catchment areas, and November 27 when the Board of Trustees meets to vote on this proposal. I will be at both meetings. Our School Planning Council met for a district level orientation on October 28th. We will convene as soon as Katherin Beselt is well. Rebecca Leaf will be on a world tour and Kristine Vodarek (Sara Gramiak) will fill in during her absence. Goals for next year will include a community building focus as well as an academic goal.

Our future playground news: The district will support and maintain an enhanced playground structure (like an Adventure Playground) to a maximum value of \$57,000 in today's dollars to buy new and install. This is because the district absorbs all liability and maintenance costs. Other PACs have applied to purchase and install something 'bigger and better' and have been refused based on this policy and enhancement agreement. As to when, the timeline is up to us and the district will give us a 'two year warning' when the structure is no longer considered safe. We can replace it before then, in conversation with the school district.

Teaching and Learning

Please visit the Ministry of Education's website to preview the new draft curriculum work being done – very exciting and work we are very much in line with at Shannon Lake Elementary. The language being used is reflecting the changes we are seeing in 21st Century learning and the attributes our District has set as criteria for the kind of learners we will graduate. In that vein, the language is shifting from 'reporting' to 'communicating student learning'....so let me inform you that we will be communicating your student's learning to/with you on December 6 when Term 1 progress reports will be sent home.

Teachers are collaborating across classrooms and subject areas, and supporting one another to improve instruction. Our CMOS (Collaborative Model of Support) Team is working to support students in the classroom and in targeted intervention beyond the classroom when necessary. Already primary students have received support for 5-6 weeks and no longer require the extra time – excellent results.

Operating two lunchtimes and two recesses is working well, but we are continually stretched for adequate supervision. Students have been outstanding at cooperating with changing expectations as we shift play areas, etc to accommodate everyone fairly over the course of a week. We have introduced a new bell that rings at 11:20 to remind everyone to get ready for outside, and to bring our kindies in from the playground. It is working well. Students are still missing the forest, but are moving forward. Thanks for remembering that we do not encourage toys at school – they are lost, stolen, broken or even thrown over the fence into that forest!

Curling is in place and booked for November 18 – thank you so much for this wonderful suggestion and we'll look forward to growing this program next year after our initial experience.
